ChatGPT, which can produce human-like responses to text prompts, and DALL-E, which can create images and artworks from text prompts, are popular examples of generative AI.

Generative AI can help teachers follow the prescribed guidelines for teaching in an efficient way without spending hours going through multiple reading materials.

2. High Cost: Developing and maintaining AI systems can be expensive.
3. Lack of Creativity: AI cannot think creatively or emotionally like humans.
4. Security Risks: AI can be misused for hacking, surveillance, or creating fake content (like deepfakes).




EARBUD ACTIVITY

The Nursery students actively participated in a variety of fun and educational activities throughout the month. The theme focused on enhancing their early learning skills through play-based methods.




All the students of pre-primary actively participated in the colouring competition conducted by Eco club
